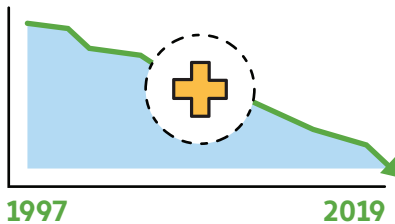


# TOP TEN WAYS MEDICAID HELPS CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Medicaid covers more than 45 million children in more ways than one. The program provides comprehensive care – including school-based services like speech and physical therapy, counseling, and transportation – to ensure our kids have healthy futures. **Here are the top ten facts you should know about how Medicaid serves children and their families.**



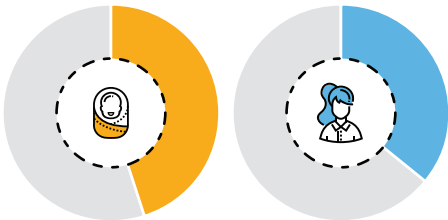
**45 million children** currently receive health coverage through Medicaid or CHIP.<sup>1</sup>



Thanks to Medicaid and CHIP, **just 4.8 percent of American children are uninsured** – down from 67.9 percent in 1997.<sup>2</sup>



Children make up **43 percent of the total US Medicaid population.**<sup>3</sup>



Medicaid and CHIP play a critical role in providing health coverage to young children, **covering 45 percent of children under the age of six** and **36 percent of children between the ages of six and 18.**<sup>4</sup>



Children who have access to Medicaid coverage **are less likely to drop out of high school and more likely to graduate from college.**<sup>5</sup>



**Medicaid provides health care to children who need it most**, covering 44 percent of children with special health care needs.<sup>6</sup>

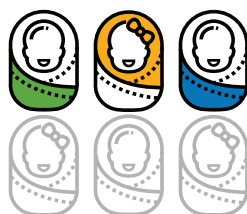
# Medicaid and CHIP provide coverage for most young children with family incomes near the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)

Medicaid and CHIP cover **81 percent** of children under 6 from families making less than \$27,821 annually.

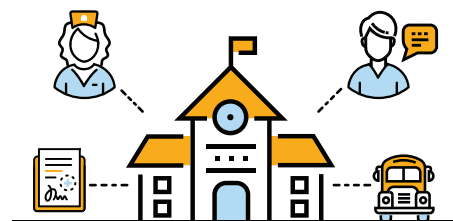
Medicaid and CHIP cover **74 percent** of children under 6 from families making less than \$40,320 annually.<sup>7</sup>



**Medicaid provides coverage for working families.** 64.5 percent of children enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP live in a family with at least one full-time worker.<sup>8</sup>



Medicaid and CHIP support **approximately 50 percent of all births in the United States.**<sup>9</sup>



**Medicaid spent about \$4 billion on school-based health care services in 2015**, including assessments, speech and physical therapy, counseling, medical services, and special transportation.<sup>10</sup>
