

Key Facts About Missouri's Medicaid Program

Medicaid is a crucial source of coverage for Missouri residents, covering more than 804,000 people in the state, with the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) covering another 38,000 children.

More than 50% of those covered by Medicaid in Missouri are children.

- Through Medicaid, children receive comprehensive coverage including primary, acute and preventative care, hospital care, dental and vision under MO Health Net for Kids.
- 47% of children with special health care needs in Missouri are covered by Medicaid.

Medicaid is a critical source of coverage for underserved and vulnerable populations in Missouri.

- Nearly 20% of those covered by Medicaid are people with disabilities and 8% are older adults.
- Medicaid covers nearly two-thirds of all nursing home residents.

Medicaid improves health care access and outcomes in Missouri.

- <u>88%</u> of Missouri adults on Medicaid indicated that they had seen a doctor in the past year, compared to only 57% of uninsured adults.
- 86% of Missouri Medicaid enrollees say they were satisfied with their health coverage over the previous year.

Expanding Medicaid in Missouri would provide significant health and economic benefits.

- Medicaid expansion in Missouri would expand coverage to an estimated <u>230,000</u> individuals.
- Medicaid expansion could increase economic output by \$2.5 billion and create an estimated 16,000 jobs per year
 throughout the state. That's why groups like the Missouri Chamber of Commerce and Industry are backing the
 measure.

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
