

87% of Americans agree: it's important to have a strong, sustainable Medicaid program in the US




The Modern Medicaid Alliance spoke to thousands of Americans across the country to hear their thoughts on the Medicaid program. What we found might surprise you.



72% of Americans have a favorable view of Medicaid. That's an 8 percentage point increase from just two years ago.

Fewer than 20% of Americans support cutting Medicaid funding.

High majorities of residents in key swing states have a favorable view of Medicaid, including:




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
