

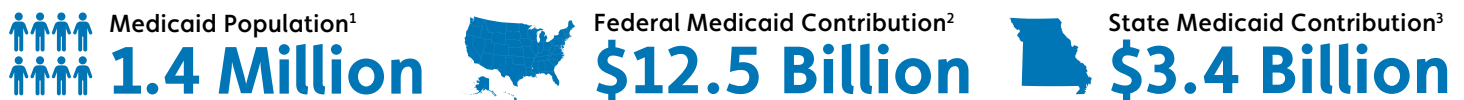


What Medicaid Cuts Mean for Missouri

Medicaid is a Lifeline in Missouri

Medicaid plays a critical role in Missouri, supporting the health of children, older adults, people with disabilities and hardworking families — while also providing critical access to care through hospitals, nursing homes and rural providers statewide.

Where Missouri's Medicaid Funding Comes From



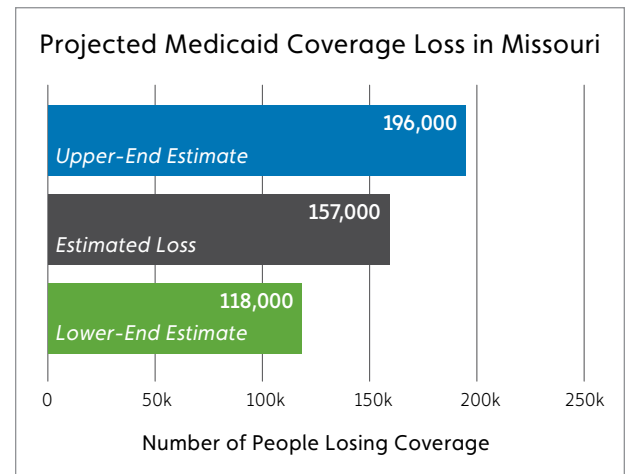
What's at Stake

The proposed Medicaid cuts outlined in H.R. 1 would strip health coverage away from Missouri residents and force significant economic trade-offs, leaving taxpayers footing the bill to cover funding gaps.

The combination of cuts included in the bill would **reduce federal Medicaid funding to Missouri by 10%**, totaling roughly **\$12 billion over the next decade**.⁴

Projected Medicaid Coverage Loss in Missouri⁵

If Congress enacts the proposed Medicaid cuts, up to **196,000 Missourians could lose coverage**. Even under the most conservative estimate, **over 118,000 people would be pushed out of the program** as a result of eligibility restrictions, administrative red tape and reduced funding for outreach and enrollment efforts.



Estimated Economic Impact of Medicaid Work Requirements in Missouri⁶

Work requirements would limit Medicaid eligibility and result in a reduction in economic activity, shrink the workforce and undercut state and local tax revenues.



Congress must protect Medicaid to keep Missouri families healthy and the state economy strong.
