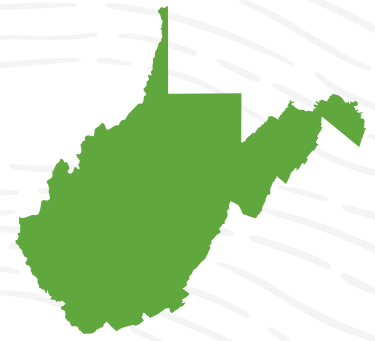


What Medicaid Cuts Mean for West Virginia





Medicaid is a Lifeline in West Virginia

Medicaid plays a critical role in West Virginia, supporting the health of children, older adults, people with disabilities and hardworking families — while also providing critical access to care through hospitals, nursing homes and rural providers statewide.

\$1 Billion

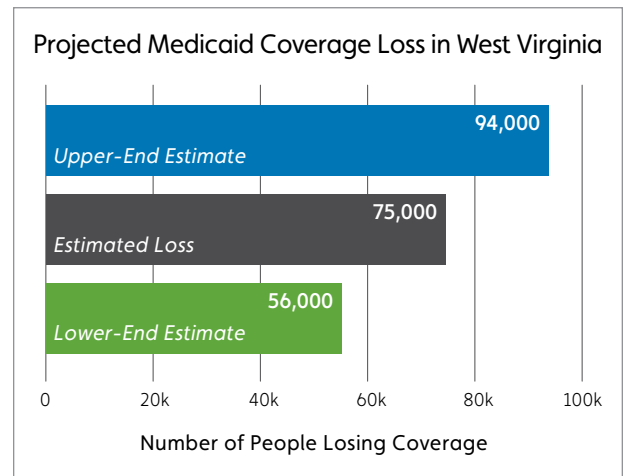
What's at Stake

The proposed Medicaid cuts outlined in H.R. 1 would strip health coverage away from West Virginia residents and force significant economic trade-offs, leaving taxpayers footing the bill to cover funding gaps.

The combination of cuts included in the bill would **reduce federal Medicaid funding to West Virginia by 12%**, totaling roughly **\$6 billion over the next decade**.⁴

Projected Medicaid Coverage Loss in West Virginia⁵

If Congress enacts the proposed Medicaid cuts, up to **94,000 West Virginians could lose coverage**. Even under the most conservative estimate, **over 56,000 people would be pushed out of the program** as a result of eligibility restrictions, administrative red tape and reduced funding for outreach and enrollment efforts.




Estimated Economic Impact of Medicaid Work Requirements in West Virginia⁶

Work requirements would limit Medicaid eligibility and result in a reduction in economic activity, shrink the workforce and undercut state and local tax revenues.

 **State GDP Loss:**
\$233M – \$329M

 **State & Local Tax Revenue Loss:**
\$15.9M – \$22.5M

 **Total Jobs Lost:**
2,100 – 3,000

Congress must protect Medicaid to keep West Virginia families healthy and the state economy strong.
